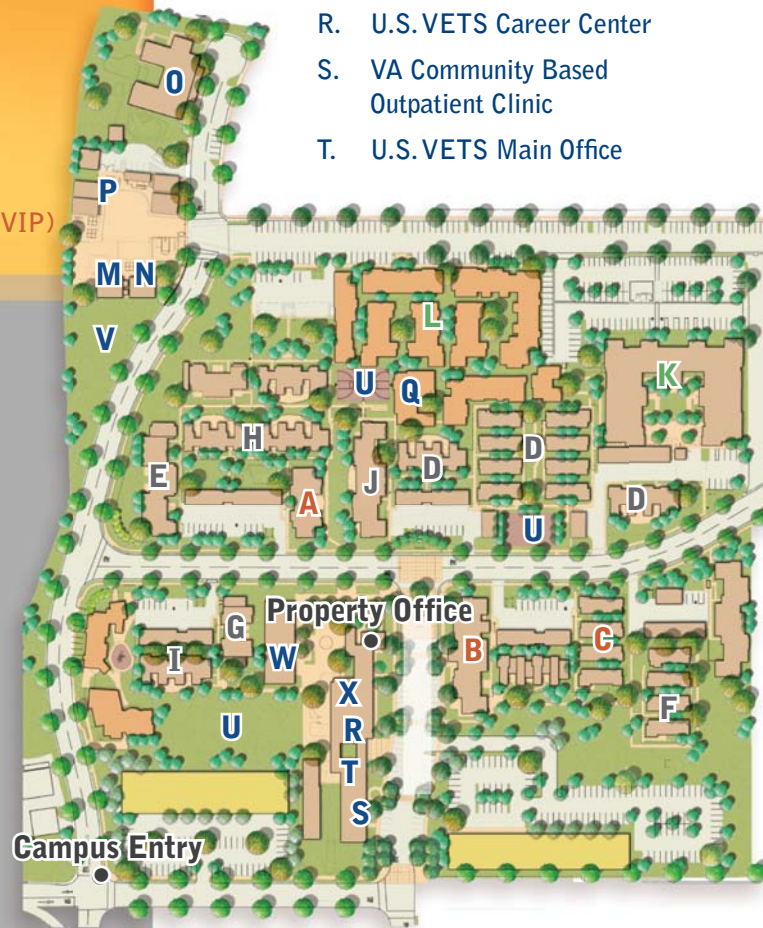

## CAMPUS SERVICES

Residents within any stage of our continuum are supported by an array of nurturing programs and services. These services are geared around increasing independence and self-sufficiency, bolstering the mission of the campus.

### Oasis Community Center

In conjunction with Cal State Long Beach and federal funding, the Oasis Community Center acts as a conduit of research, volunteerism, and service delivery to the CVC Community. The center maintains a community computer lab and provides space for community-wide programming. (562) 388-8080

### Los Angeles Habilitation House

LAHH offers employment training and career opportunities in green janitorial services & record and document management (digitalization, storage, secure destruction) to persons who live with disabilities, including veterans. (562) 388-8073

### Comprehensive Child Development

Child care and a quality early childhood education curriculum are offered for children whose parents work, are in job training, and/or are seeking permanent housing. (562) 388-8160

### Bethune Transitional Center

Operated by Long Beach Unified School District, the Bethune Transitional Center is an intake center for homeless, school-age children which provides school uniforms, shoes, and supplies. The center assists with enrollment into school while providing academic and counseling support. (562) 435-2050

### Century/LIFT

Century/LIFT provides after school tutoring and homework assistance to facilitate academic growth among at-risk students, to cultivate good study habits, and to develop the necessary skills for academic success. (562) 299-5730

### U.S. VETS Career Center

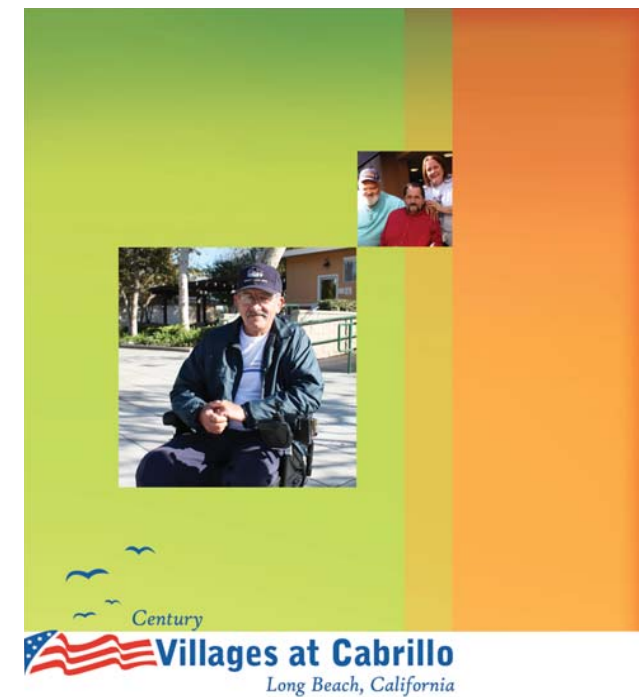

## OUR MISSION

Century Villages at Cabrillo (CVC) is a residential community whose mission is to break the cycle of homelessness and encourage self-sufficiency, dignity, and the highest human potential for residents. This mission is rooted in a comprehensive continuum of supportive housing that has been developed on the campus, ranging from shelter and treatment, to transitional and permanent housing.

## OUR HISTORY

A former 26 acre US Naval housing site, CVC utilizes an innovative public-private partnership model to benefit those in need. Established in 1997 when the US Department of Defense conveyed the land under the McKinney Act for the benefit of the homeless, CVC has subsequently developed into a unique therapeutic community that provides housing on any given night to over 1,000 persons. Residents include veteran and non-veteran individuals, families, youth and children. More than simply providing shelter, CVC has co-located a palette of valuable social services to help residents regain their independence within a pioneering supportive housing continuum.

## SHORT TERM HOUSING

Length of stay: 30 to 90 days

Our emergency shelter and treatment programs provide basic shelter and care to individuals or families in crisis. Short term in nature, shelter programs seek to stabilize clients and prepare them for more independent living arrangements.



### Catholic Charities

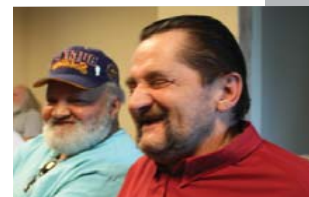
The Elizabeth Ann Seton Residence is a 40 bed emergency family shelter operated by Catholic Charities. Seniors and disabled persons qualify. (562) 388-7670

### Veterans Village Recovery Center

The VVRC is a 38 bed, 30 to 90 day intensive substance abuse treatment program for veterans, operated by the Long Beach VA HCS with housing supported by the United States Veterans Initiative. (562) 826-8460

### U.S. VETS Veterans In Progress (VIP)

VIP is a 70 bed 90 day work re-entry program for unemployed, homeless veterans that have a minimum of 60 days clean and sober if referred from a substance abuse treatment program and 90 days clean and sober if self referred. (562) 388-7982



## TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

Length of stay: Up to 2 years+

Our transitional housing programs foster independent living skills and self-sufficiency, helping to prepare residents for permanent, autonomous living.

### Long Beach Savannah Housing

(in conjunction with U.S. VETS)

Long Beach Savannah Housing (LBSH) provides affordable transitional housing to individuals with a minimum of 90 days clean and sober, an ability to pay rent, and abide by program regulations. LBSH offers both single and double rooms for a total occupancy of 120 veterans. (562) 388-7982

### New Image Emergency Shelter for the Homeless, Inc. (Project Stepping Stone)

For over twenty years, New Image has operated Emergency and Transitional Housing Programs throughout Los Angeles County. This program provides extensive and comprehensive case management services and unmatched permanent housing placement and retention for every client served, with a two year follow-up. ### American Indian Changing Spirits

Changing Spirits is an 18 bed substance abuse treatment facility for Native American men. (562) 388-8118

### Salvation Army Transitional Living Center

The Salvation Army's Transitional Living Center (TLC) is the primary transitional living program for homeless mothers and their children. The program provides a safe and healing refuge for families to evaluate their lives after a crisis while teaching them strategies that will put them on the road to permanent self-sufficiency. The focus of the program is empowerment through education and vocational training leading to employment and independent housing. The TLC has capacity for up to 15 families. (562) 388-7600

### U.S. VETS ADVANCE Women's Program

Run by U.S. VETS, ADVANCE Women's Program is a residential program designed to assist unemployed, homeless women in obtaining employment and permanent housing. A special component of this program provides comprehensive services to women who have experienced sexual trauma. (562) 388-8102

### U.S. VETS Veterans Re-Entry Program

The Veteran Re-Entry Program (VRP) is a 23 bed program providing comprehensive services to recently separated Afghanistan and Iraq veterans. Administered by U.S. VETS, the VRP program assists recently separated veterans in the transition from military to civilian life. (562) 388-7989

### U.S. VETS Social Independent Living Skills

The Social Independent Living Skills Program (SILS) is a 32 bed residential program administered by U.S. VETS. (562) 733-2767

## PERMANENT HOUSING

Length of stay: Indefinite

Our permanent housing facilities, for both families and veterans, is the final step in the housing continuum. Our permanent housing is enriched with supportive services, ensuring that individuals, families, and children have critical resources at their disposal to facilitate continued growth.

### Cabrillo Plaza (Casa de Cabrillo) (in conjunction with U.S. VETS)

Casa de Cabrillo provides 200 efficiency apartments for single veterans. 130 apartments are equipped with private bathroom and kitchen areas while 70 apartments utilize shared baths, kitchens, and common areas within a suite setting. Rental support is available for disabled and homeless veterans through the Shelter plus Care and PHD programs. Housing is supported by U.S. VETS. (562) 388-8092



### Family Commons at Cabrillo (in conjunction with PATH Ventures)

Family Commons at Cabrillo provides 80 apartment homes for large families. Families are supported by an array of supportive services including case management, employment assistance, and rental subsidy provided through PATH Ventures. 40 apartments are set aside for families with physical and/or mental disabilities and who were previously homeless.
